Earlier this month, arbitration services provider JAMS announced that it created a new set of Mass Arbitration Procedures and Guidelines ("Mass Procedures") for use in mass arbitrations. Like competitor American Arbitration Association's ("AAA") update to its mass arbitration supplementary rules ("AAA Supplementary Rules") earlier this year, JAMS's new procedures include some features that may mitigate some of the more abusive practices common to mass arbitrations, but do not fully eliminate the risks posed by mass arbitrations.
