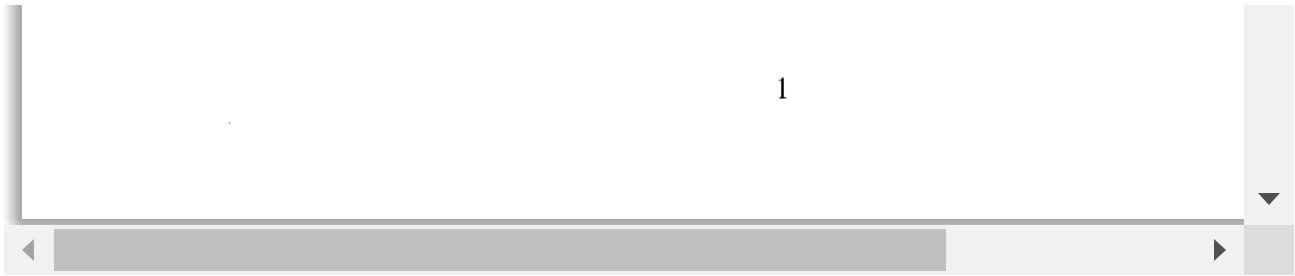

**OPINION**

Plaintiff Molly Cramer (“Plaintiff”) commenced this copyright infringement filing a Complaint (ECF No. 1) against Defendants Netflix, Inc. (“Netflix”) and Royal Goode Productions, LLC (“Royal Goode”) (collectively, “Defendants”). Currently pending before the Court is Defendants’ Motion to Dismiss for Failure to State a Claim (ECF No. 14) and Plaintiff’s Motion for Support (ECF No. 17). Defendants also filed a Request for Judicial Notice in Support of their Motion to Dismiss Complaint Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(6) (ECF No. 19), with the assistance of Plaintiff’s counsel, wherein Defendants request that the Court take judicial notice of the existence of a DVD/USB flash drive containing the first episode of the second season of the “T” reality-based series (the “Episode”) which is streamed on Netflix.

On February 13, 2023, Plaintiff filed a Memorandum of Law in Opposition to Defendants’ Motion to Dismiss the Complaint Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(6) (ECF No. 26) and Plaintiff’s Motion for Support in Opposition to Defendants’ Motion to Dismiss Complaint (ECF No. 27), and Defendants filed a Reply (ECF No. 28) thereto. Pursuant to the Court’s Order (ECF No. 29), on June 15, 2023, both parties both filed supplemental briefs (ECF Nos. 30 and 31) to address the impact of the
